The CCAS SEMINAR FOR DEPARTMENT CHAIRS provides a forum in which chairs — new and experienced — can examine the art of departmental administration through close interaction with colleagues from multiple disciplines and from institutions around the country. Presentations by experienced department chairs will focus upon actual techniques that chairs use, as well as ideal models of administration. Group discussion is critical to the seminar format. Registration, therefore, is limited to 40 participants. Two social hours, breakfast and lunch on the second day, and continental breakfast on the third day will facilitate interchange among participants.
