CANCELLATION OF THE PARIS DEANS SEMINAR

For the past two years, the CCAS Board has been entertaining the possibility of holding a Deans Seminar in Europe in collaboration with our fellow deans at the American universities. The proposal, in which the Board has been interested, is to hold a joint seminar in Paris with a focus on international programs and international education. Much planning and discussion has gone forward and we came quite close to scheduling this for May, 2004.

However, the Board has decided that in the current fiscal climate, few of us are likely to be able to avail themselves of institutional travel funds to attend such a seminar --- especially at a time when faculty travel is being cut and a trip to Paris by the Dean would be subject to multiple interpretations with few being complementary to the decanal traveler.

The Board continues to hope that when the economic times are better, this can be a high priority for a future Deans Seminar.

The New Deans' Seminar is scheduled for July 13- 16, 2003 in Minneapolis, MN. The Department Chairs' seminar is scheduled for July 10 - 12, 2003 in Minneapolis, MN. Brochures for the New Deans' and Departmental Chairs' Seminars were mailed in January.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS NOTE: A Change in the Renewal Process

Your 2003-2004 membership renewal information will be sent to you shortly. Membership renewal will be conducted in a two-phase process this year to make it move more smoothly. The first phase is gathering the information for the membership directory for the next academic year. The second phase is the invoicing. You will be asked to confirm your membership directory entry, including names, email addresses, and phone numbers for you and your associate and assistant deans. Updating this information ensures that we accurately represent your institution in the 2003-2004 CCAS Membership Directory.

As soon as you submit the updated Membership Directory Information Page(s), the CCAS office will fax a confirmation of their receipt and an invoice that will allow you to calculate you dues for the 2003-2004 academic year. Responding to this invoice by paying your institutional dues represents the second phase of this twophase process. Please note that you will not receive an invoice until Membership Directory Information Page(s) have been received and acknowledged by the CCAS office. By separating this membership directory/renewal process into two phases, we hope to clarify the purpose of each phase and to simplify the whole. We would certainly appreciate your comments about our efforts and would give careful consideration to any suggestions for improvement.

→<u>REMINDER ABOUT CCAS MEMBERSHIP</u>←

The CCAS Member is the <u>INSTITUTION</u>, not the Dean or the individual College. When the institution calculates the number of degrees, remember to include all degree-granting colleges of arts and sciences disciplines in the total. It is up to the institution to divide the dues among the colleges. Some institutions divide the dues equally, some institutions divide the dues based upon the size of the college, and others rotate the dues responsibility between colleges on a yearly basis. Deans, please speak with your colleagues and determine your institution's method.

If a Dean moves from a CCAS member institution to a non-member institution, the Dean must apply for CCAS membership for the new institution to have the benefits of CCAS membership.
