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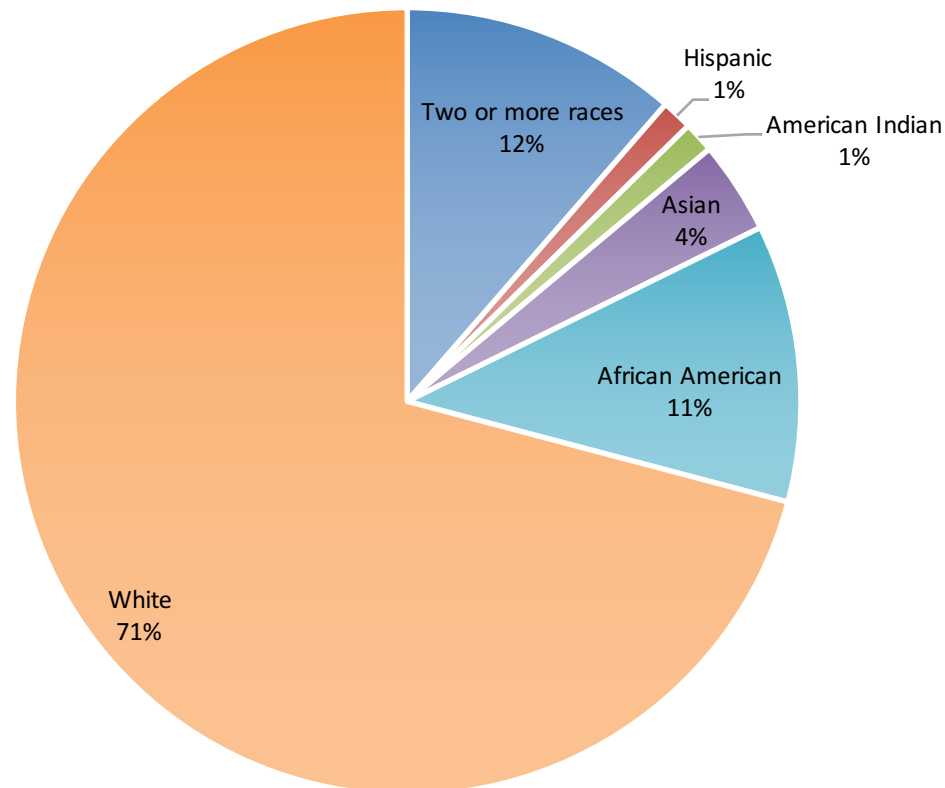

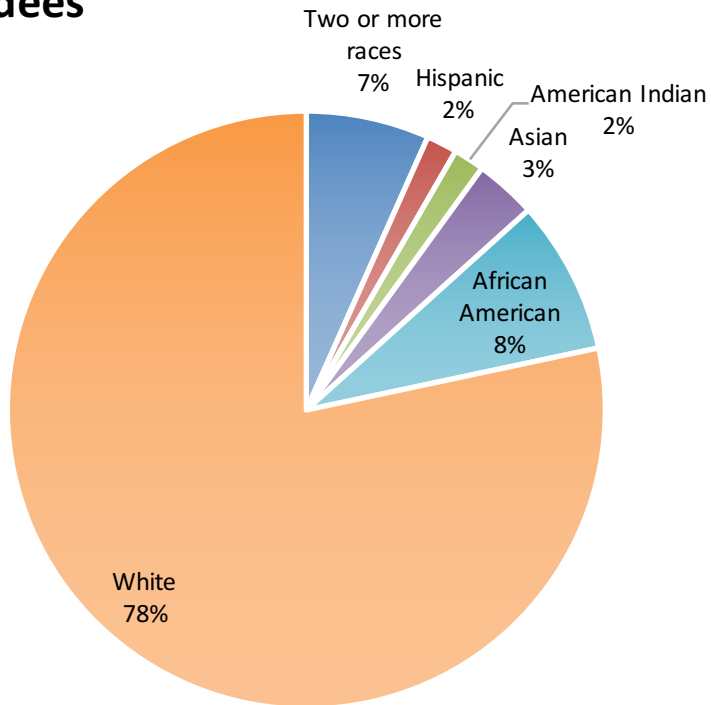
# Undergraduate Research Awardees' Demographics

2013-2016

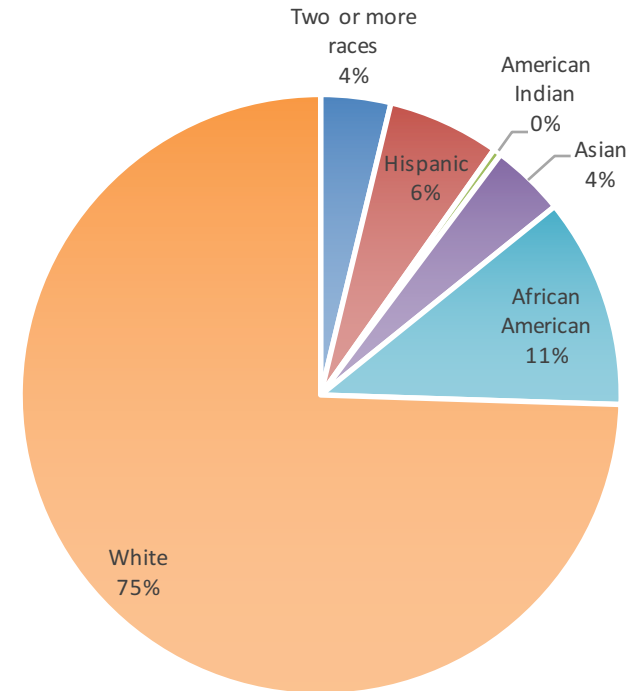


# Undergraduate Research Awardees' Demographics (2013-2016, without anomalous year)

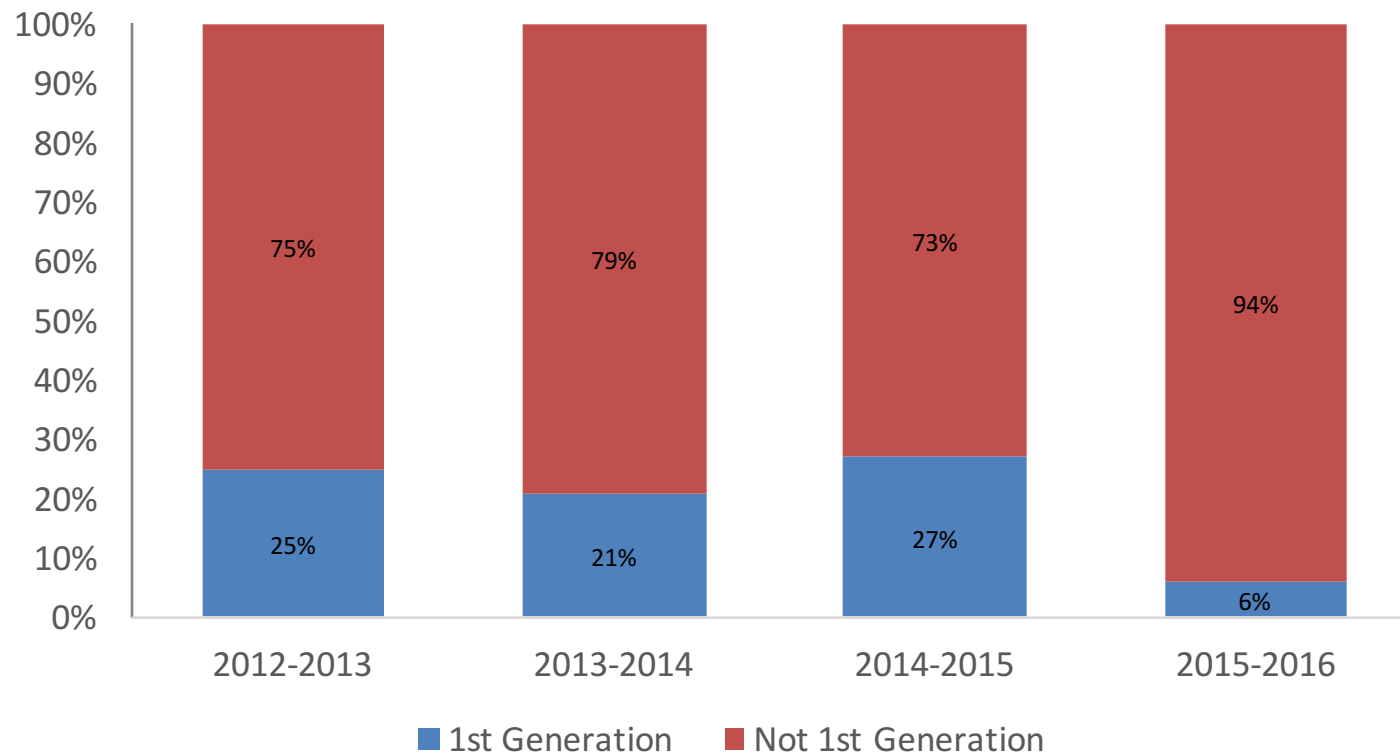

# Undergraduate Research Awardees' Demographics (2013-2016)



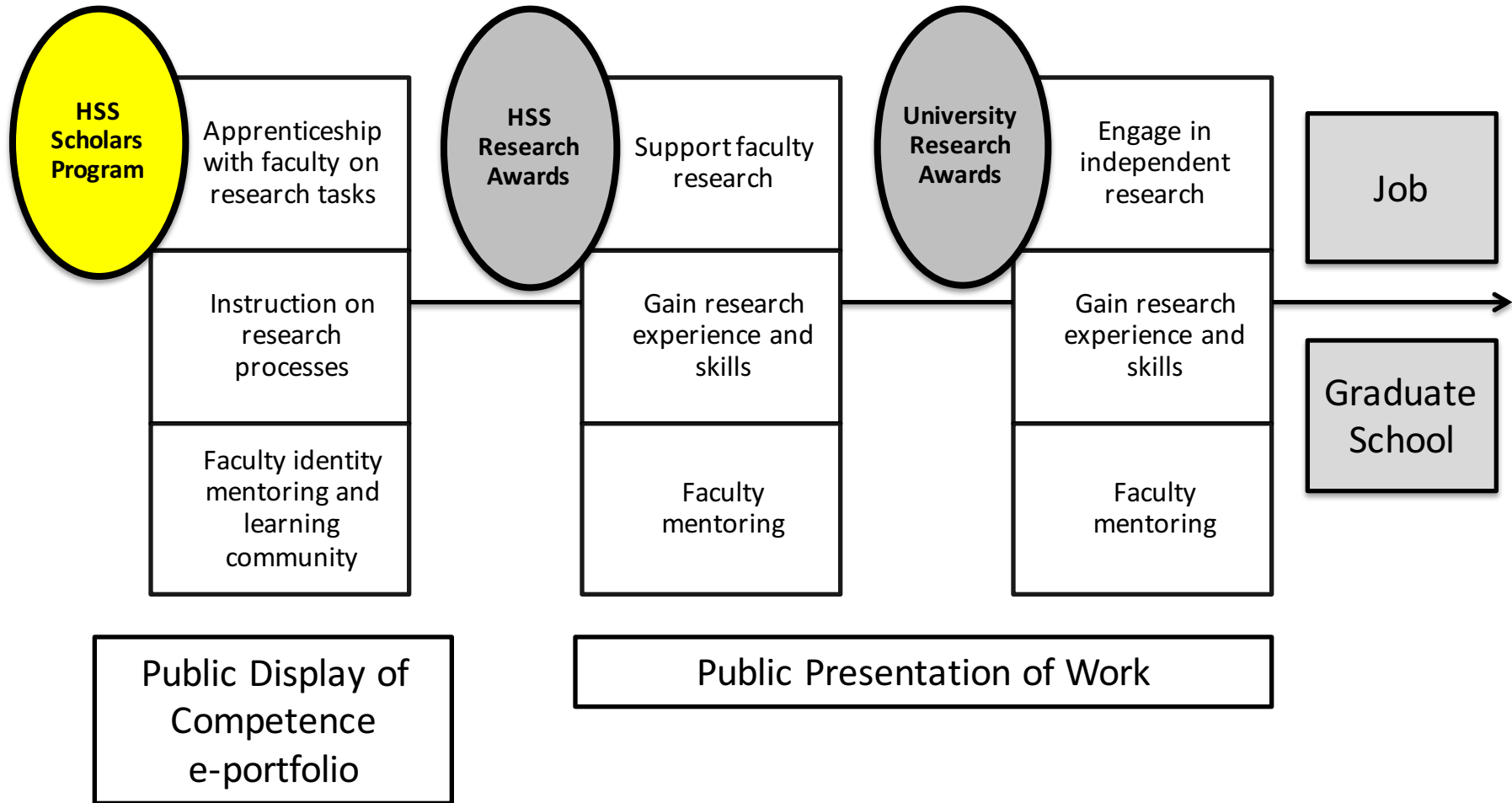
## **Bottom line:**

- Current NC State Humanities/Social Sciences Undergraduate Research Awards program is highly successful
- But:
  - Below college average in terms of % representation of underrepresented minorities
  - Below university average in terms of % representation of first generation students

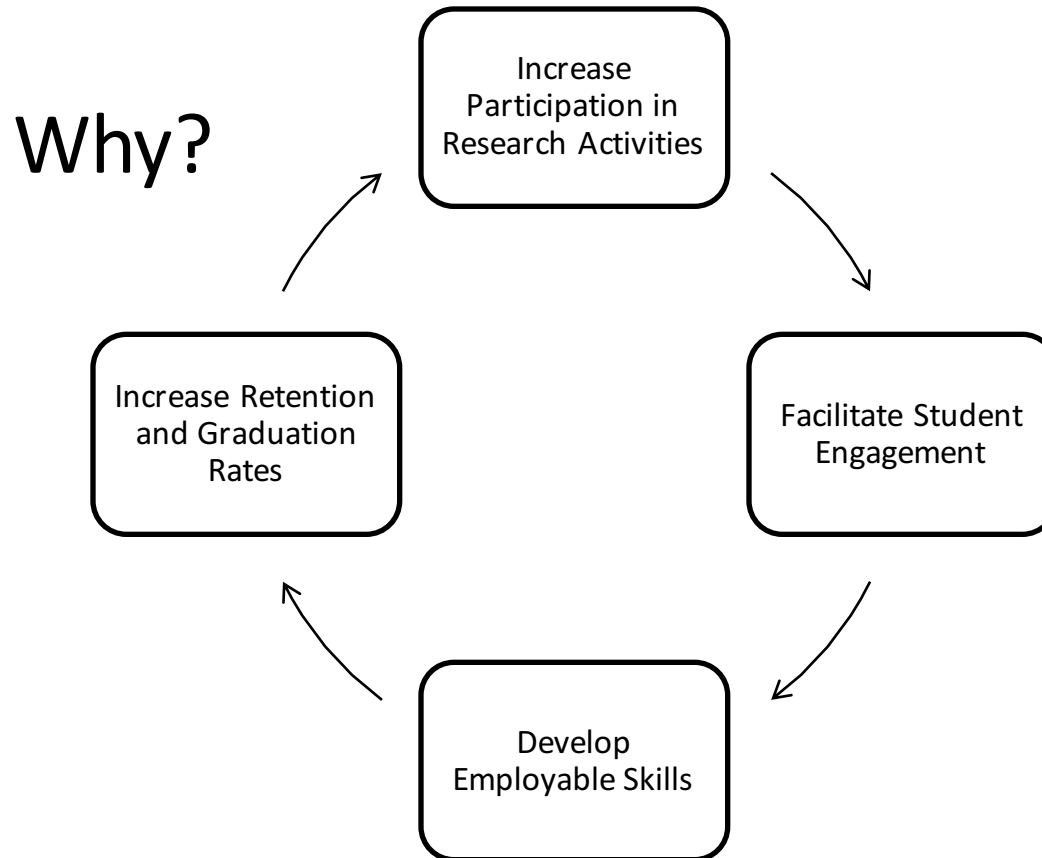


# **Facilitating Access and Equity: Humanities and Social Sciences Scholars Program**

## **Goal: Implementation 2018**

- 2-year scholars program
- Learning community model
- Summer Institute/Monthly Mentoring Roundtables
- Faculty/peer mentoring
- Conference attendance/experience
- Pilot with 10 scholars
- Rising sophomores from underserved populations  
(underrepresented minorities, first generation college students, veterans, students with disabilities)

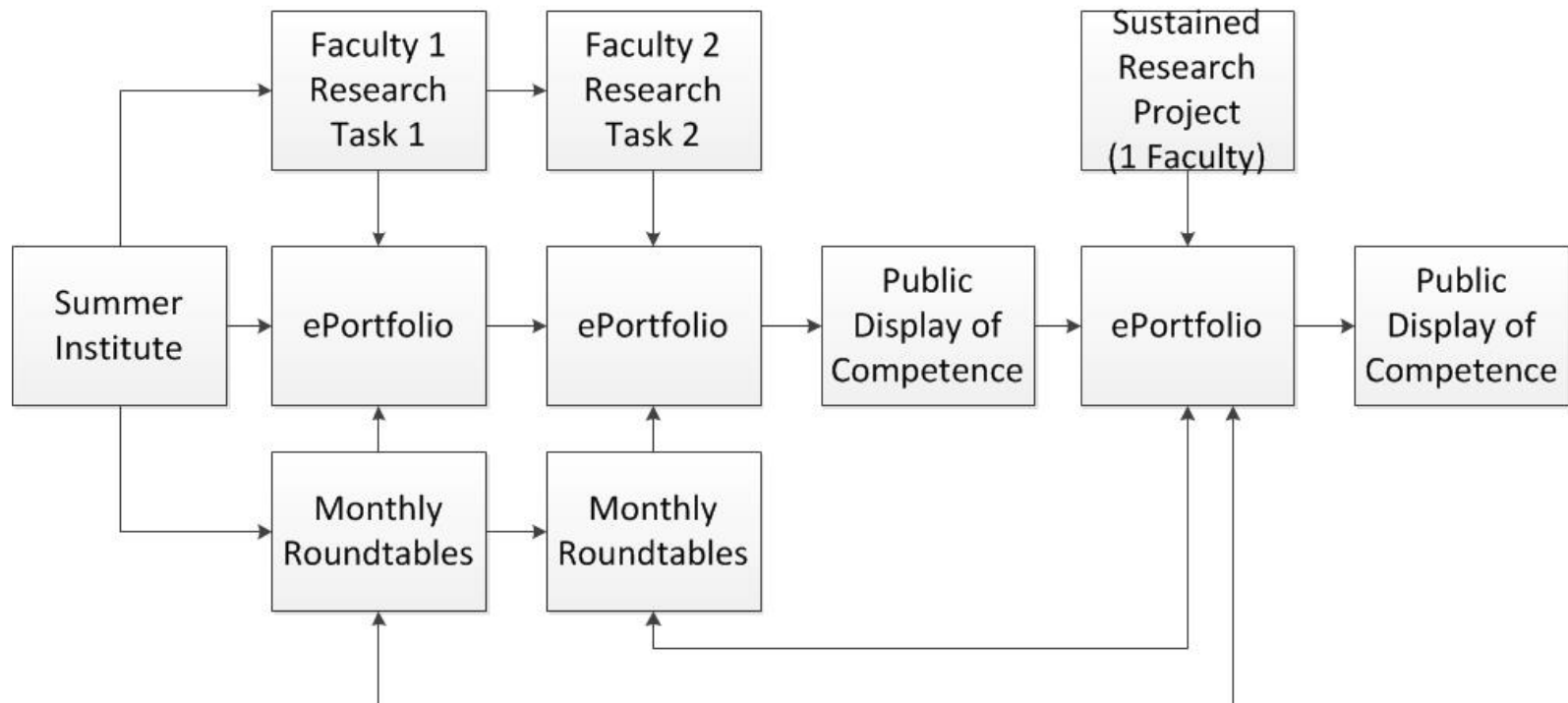

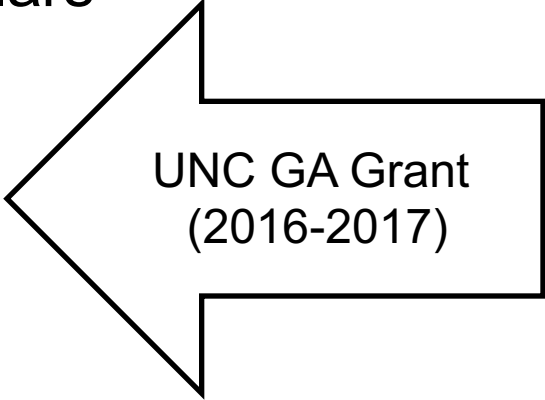

## Where to start?

- Forge partnership with Winston Salem State University
- Build inter-unit planning team (academic affairs, assessment, diversity)
- Develop program infrastructure (Scholars Planning Institute)
  - Create instructional materials to support program
  - Train faculty to be mentors for underserved students

# **Scholars Planning Institute**

## **June 2017**

- Create an instructional portal that facilitates students' development of a scholarly identity through learning:
  - research/inquiry skills
  - professional development skills
- Train faculty to understand issues related to mentoring our intended population
- Build a collaborative network of engaged faculty

## Participants

- 10 faculty (5 from NC State, 5 from Winston Salem State)
  - Psychology
  - Social Justice
  - History
  - Public Administration
  - Philosophy
  - Criminology
  - Music
  - Sociology



# Planning Institute Major Activities

- Brainstorming Session & Mapping Project Deliverables
- Student Panel: Learning from target population
- Lunch & Learns: Unconscious bias, privilege & identity, microaggressions, feedback from experts
- Working Groups
- Group Presentations & Feedback





# Planning Institute Outcomes

- Teaching Modules
  - Learning objectives/outcomes
  - Content/instructional materials to meet outcomes
  - Activities to engage students and meet outcomes
  - Supporting materials
- Three groups: All focused on overall outcome of developing a scholarly identity; creating two modules each:
  - Research/Inquiry Skills (novice level)
  - Professional Engagement Skills (novice level)

## **Phase 2: 2017-2018 Pilot**

- UNC GA Grant (2017-2018): Using E-Portfolios for Mentoring and Assessment of Underserved Undergraduate Researchers
- 5 students each institution engaged in undergraduate research; 10 faculty become “Identity Mentors”
- Students develop e-portfolios with mentors that demonstrate scholarly development
  - LinkedIn profile/bio, resume/CV, informational interview
  - Research abstract, elevator speech, poster presentation

# **Identity Mentors**

## **Humanities and Social Sciences Scholars**

- Two models
  - Research mentor as identity mentor
  - Research mentor separate from identity mentor
- Monthly professional development learning circles (facilitated by career services)
- Weekly meetings with identity mentors
- Peer feedback

# **Facilitating Access and Equity**

## **Phase 3: Implementation (2018)**

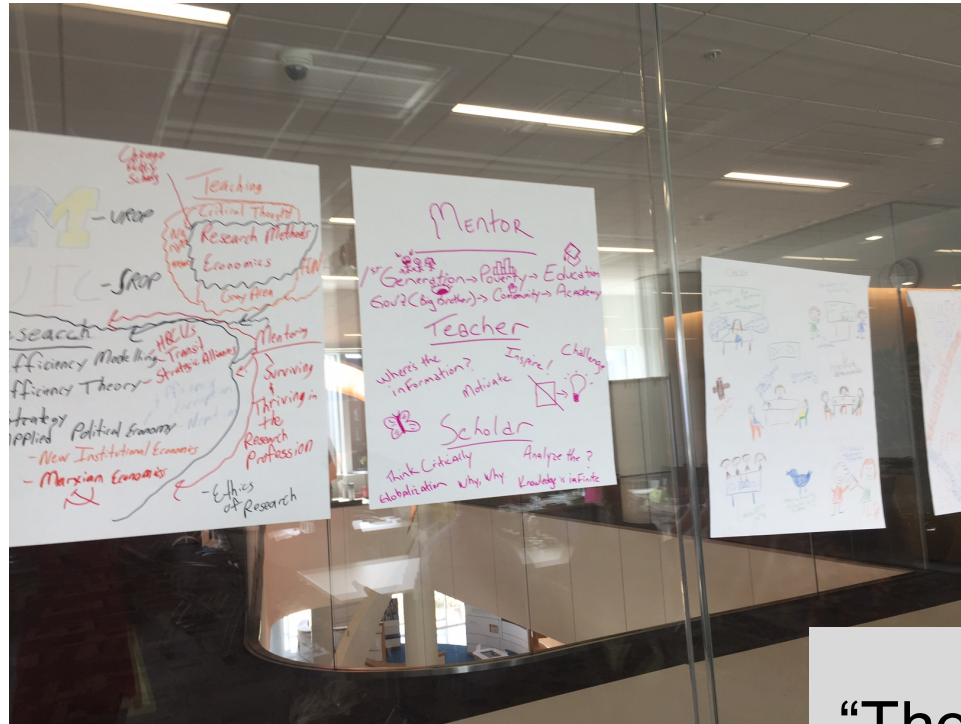
- Proof of concept: internal funding for first cohort (2017-2018)
- Gather data / showcase success
- Explore possibilities for external funding
- Document activities as a potential model for other units

## **What have we learned?**

- Leverage current resources/initiatives
- Engage champions in planning
- Create phased initiative
- Pilot beta version with different models

## **What questions remain?**

- How can we maximize inter-institutional partnership?
- How can we reach intended audience of students?
- How can we understand barriers to entry?
