- •Private urban/suburban comprehensive university with 3 campuses and 7 sites in the NY metro area
- •Just under 13,000 Students, 64% undergraduate, 36% percent graduate/ professional
- •Four Schools/Two Colleges
- •One of three Associate Deans in the College of Arts and Sciences,
- •Curriculum Development, new programs, oversee 6 departments, special projects

- •19,000 students

Administrative Challenges

Oakland University

- •General structural issues/impediments
 - Unionized environment resistant to change
 - Program director problems/solutions
 - •Leveraging faculty resources
- •Department of Music/Theatre/Dance seeks "School" status

University of Maine

- Departmental administrative challenges
 - •School of Performing Arts formed in 1997
 - Dept of Music; Dept of Theatre/Dance
 - •Not a happy initial merger
 - •Kept Divisions and Chairs along dept lines; next move to one Director
 - School of Computing and Information Science formed this year
 - Dept of Computer Science; Dept of Spatial Engineering
 - •Issues of grad/undergrad; resources; leadership
 - •Have Director (Spatial) and Assoc Dir (Computer Science)

New Academic Programs

Pace University

- •B.A. in Film and Screen Studies
 - •Creating a new administrative structure, interdisciplinary, cross-departmental
 - •Turf wars; personality issues; leadership; curricular development; ownership

Oakland University

- •B.A. in Liberal Studies
 - •Developing a college-wide program for FTIAC students
 - •Contending with a university-wide BGS program

University of Maine

- •B.S. in Climate Change and Culture
 - •Cross-departmental (Anthropology and Earth Sciences)
 - •Administrative issues: resources; counting majors; advising

Disciplinary Initiatives

University of Maine

- •UMaine Humanities Initiative
 - •Create organizational structure for programming, funding, development
 - •Issues in faculty buy-in; everyone on board?; what direction to go in
 - •Want to create a Center; need funding

Pace University

- •Blended and online teaching
 - •Issues of intellectual property
 - •Stipends and banked credit
